crochet pattern



materials & tools

- Yarn:
 - Weight: DK/Light Worsted
 - Material: 100% Cotton
 - Color(s): bright pink, green & white
- Hook: 3mm
- Tapestry Needle
- Stuffing
- Stitch Markers
- Scissors

abbreviations

This pattern is written in US terms

size: 3.5 inches including leaves

pattern notes

- 01 Size:** Gauge doesn't matter! I have included the size of the finished toy based on my yarn weight and hook size, but if you want yours bigger just use a bigger yarn and hook.
- 02 Yarn:** Take your choice of yarn! Choose colors and fibers that bring you joy. I use 100% cotton yarn because I make these toys for my kids and need them to be natural, washable, durable & soft.
- 03 Stuffing:** Choose the stuffing you like best - poly, wool, leftover yarn scraps. I use poly filling because it's texture is predictable and it is washable.
- 04 Special Stitches:** This pattern uses a half double crochet (hdc). You can find a video tutorial of this stitch on my website if you need help!

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leaves - make 3

The leaves are crocheted around a base chain using the green yarn.

Rnd 1: ch 6, sc in the 2nd ch from hook, hdc in the next 3 st, 4 hdc in the last st of chain. Continue on the other side of the ch: hdc in the next 3 st, inc in the last st [13]

Rnd 2: sc in next st, (ch 2, sl st in next st) x12, sc in next st, ch 7
Cut yarn leaving a 4 inch tail. Pull tail through final chain and pull tight to fasten. Weave in starting yarn. **photo 1**

radish

The radish is worked in a continuous round, beginning with the pink yarn.

Rnd 1: st 6 in a magic circle [6]

Rnd 2: inc in each st around [12]

Rnd 3: (sc in next st, inc in next st) x6 [18]

Rnd 4: (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) x6 [24]

Rnd 5-7: sc in each st around [24]

Using a tapestry needle, pull the end yarns from the 3 leaves through the magic circle to the inside of the radish. **photo 02** Knot them securely with the starting yarn of the radish.

Rnd 8: (sc in next 2 st, dec in next st) x6 [18]

Switch to white yarn

Rnd 9: (sc in next st, dec in next st) x6 [12] **photo 03 & 04**

Start stuffing

Rnd 10: dec in each st around [6]

Finish stuffing. Cut the yarn leaving a 6 inch tail. Using a tapestry needle, weave the yarn tail through the front loop of each remaining stitch and pull tightly to close. Make a knot as close to the radish as possible and trim the yarn, leaving roots. Fray the ends. **photo 05**

Make however many radishes you'd like! Just one, or a little bunch of them would be perfect too.
